### Preparing for Testing

#### Before the Test

- Talk about testing – Help your child understand why schools give standardized tests and why it is important for their future.
- Encourage your child – Praise your child for trying new or difficult things.
- Make sure your child attends school – If your child misses school, they will have to make up the test.
- Establish a daily routine – Your routine on test day should be as close to normal as possible. Starting the day with chaos or disruption can affect their success.

#### On Test Day

- Eat a good breakfast – Studies show that children perform better at school when they aren't hungry.
- Get enough sleep – Your child will need to have a good night's rest to perform well on the test. Children ages 7 to 12 need 10 to 12 hours of sleep a night.
- Dress your child in comfortable clothing – Students will be sitting for long periods of time.
- Prepare the night before – Lay out clothes and school supplies the night before the test to create a smooth morning routine.

### Parent Club Meeting/Bond Meeting

Ballot measure 24-429 is a general obligation bond on the May 15 ballot for school construction and renovations to address overcrowding and safety in Salem-Keizer's schools.

Parents and community members are invited to attend an informational meeting about plans for schools under the proposed \$619.7 million bond. Work, including safety and security upgrades, is planned for every school.
