From the Counselor's Desk


I heard a Ted Talk over the weekend. Reshma Saunjani spoke about the differences in which we socialize and raise boys versus girls. In general, our culture teaches boys to take chances and to be brave in the face of new things. The message girls receive is to be perfect and nice.

Saujani put it this way: "Most girls are taught to avoid failure and risk. To smile pretty, play it safe, get all A's. Boys, on the other hand, are taught to play rough, swing high, crawl to the top of the monkey bars and then jump off headfirst. They're rewarded for it I need each of you to tell every young woman you know—your sister, your niece, your employee, your colleague—to be comfortable with imperfection. Because when we teach girls to be imperfect, and we help them leverage it, we will build a movement of young women who are brave and who will build a better world—for themselves, and for each one of us." I believe this is applicable to more than the topic of male and female labels. Any label can have a similar limiting effect. Labels about race, body shape, family background, socio-economic status and more tend to lead people subconsciously to put others in boxes of limitation.
